Regarding Agenda Items

Lee Mescolotto, 1635 Lehigh Parkway N, Allentown, previously sent a letter to each Board member regarding his concerns on the proposed 2006-2007 general fund budget millage increase which is on tonight's agenda. He asked the Board to respond to his questions that were raised in the letter pertaining to the increase in the special education area and the money for the sale of the land on Emmaus Avenue.

Mr. Giordano responded that the expenditures in the special education area of the budget are subject to the special circumstances of these very special students and the kinds of services and requirements they require can vary. When the IU increases its costs, they are passed on to us. Mrs. Famularo stated that in the 2006-2007 school year, we will be taking over 2 emotional support classes in-house; therefore, our net overall increase in this area is in the neighborhood of \$200,000.00.

Regarding the land sale, Mr. Giordano responded that we have not seen any money from this sale at this time, and this money must go towards capital improvements only. Mr. Pauloski noted there were numerous meetings held where these issues were discussed in detail and any member of the community was welcome to attend.

Mr. Giordano stated that the Board has no apologies for this budget. This is a good and responsible budget. Our Board and administrators have done a great job.

Secretary of Board

Mrs. Famularo, business administrator, stated that the formal budget process began in early December of 2005 with the building principals being mandated to prepare their building budgets based on the same allocation as last year. The administration was to provide a list of items they could not include in this budget. Dr. Wright, Ms. Beauchemin, and Mrs. Famularo reviewed the budgets with the principals making appropriate cuts and/or including additional requests.

There were many challenges facing the 2006-2007 budget. The teacher contract was not settled, the PSERS contribution rate was increasing from 4.69% to 6.46%, energy costs were increasing, the IU increase, and the health insurance premium increase are just some of these. Based on this, the millage projection was estimated to be 3.5 mills or a 9% increase.

Meetings were held in February and March to discuss the takeover of 2 emotional support classes from the IU and the technology department reorganization. This, along with our health insurance renewal rates coming in lower than anticipated, brought the proposed millage to 1.954 mills or 5.05%.

Tonight on the agenda is a motion to approve the final 2006-2007 budget with a millage rate of 40.674, the same as on the tentative budget. Mrs. Famularo thanked Dr. Wright, the Board, and administrators for their input, insight, and support during the budget process.
