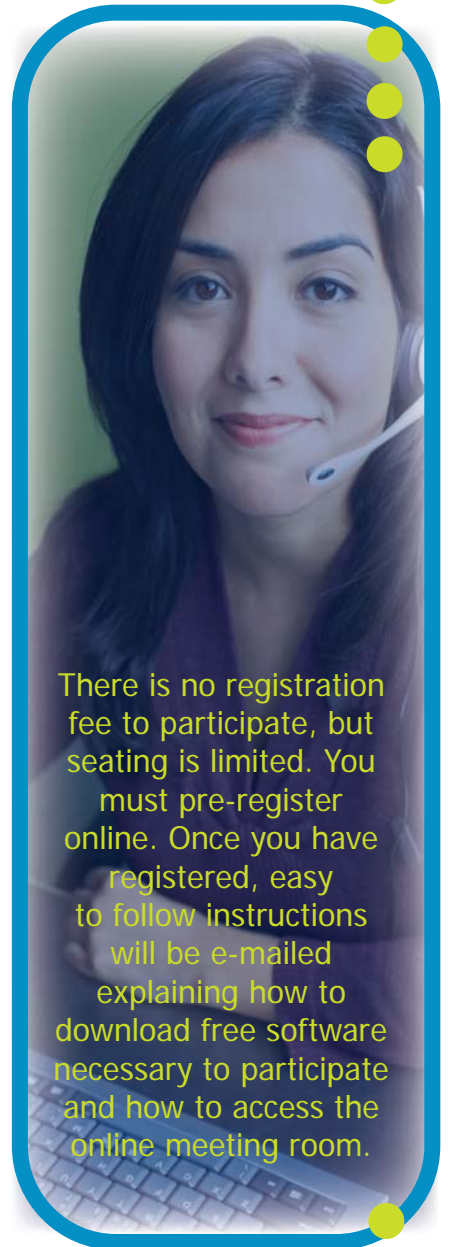

Participants will learn why inclusion is important, how they can translate a child's educational needs into an effective IEP, who can help them develop an IEP and the educational laws that protect children's rights to an education.
